Exclusive use of cow, goat, sheep and buffalo leather



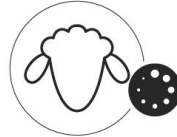
**Sustainable down**

Exclusive use of down obtained without live plucking and force feeding



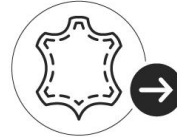
**Ban of angora wool**

Proportion of mulesing-free wool is continuously increased in pure woolen knitwear (2017: 88%)

**Guideline for use of sustainable wool**

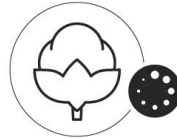
Guideline for the use of sustainable wool will be published by 2018

**Increased use of sustainable cotton**

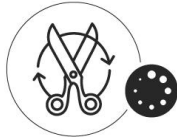
Until 2020: 50% of sustainable cotton

Other sustainable materials



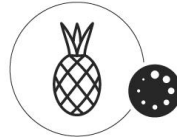
**Use of recycled materials**

Use of padding made of recycled materials (60%) in all clothing lines and accessories



**2020 Circular Fashion System Commitment**

Principles to enable closed loops will be integrated in the product development process



**Use of alternative materials**

For example vegan sneaker made of pineapple leaves as alternative to leather. Other materials to be tested in innovation lab



**Guideline for use of synthetic materials**

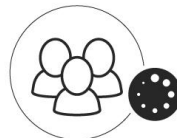
Guideline for the use of synthetic fibres will be published by 2020

Chemicals



**Active chemicals management**

HUGO BOSS Restricted Substance List (RSL) is compulsory for all suppliers. Compliance is controlled through regular product tests
